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Who Are We?

We have a team of eight staff that fulfill the roles required to successfully provide the five key services listed above.

We also have trained volunteer tutors that support the learners with lower literacy levels in a 1:1 format (waitlist)



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Training

We offer individualized training/learning programs, as well as what we call targeted training for work, learning, and life.

Programs are provided through 1:1, small group, and online (for select programs) formats. Some training/learning programs are listed below (see our website for more info.) include:

- Learning programs for people at level one (learning to read, write, etc.)
- Writing skills (spelling, grammar, paragraphs, essays, etc.)
- · Math skills
- Digital skills (computer basics, iPad/tablet, Microsoft Office, smartphones, etc.)

- Personal Finance (Financial Literacy)
- CAEC preparation (formerly the GED) Preparation to write the CAEC exams

- Crafting with Cricket
- iConnect (iPad basics)
- Social Media (Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn, etc.)

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Program Needs & Skills Identification

Program needs are researched and identified through a plethora of resources/initiatives. As active participants in the literacy service planning process and Grand Erie labour market planning initiatives, partnerships with employment service providers, employers, and Social Assistance departments (formerly Ontario Works), and through reports specific to the Grand Erie region, our team utilizes information to develop relevant programs.

Identification of skills required within our community is two-fold. We identify skills as listed in the above. We also work with individuals on identifying what skills they need in relation to job market trends, education requirements, and requirements for greater independence. We also respond to community needs by monitoring any waitlists we may have, which assists with delivering relevant and in-demand programming.

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Eligibility & Training

We serve all adults and older youth who meet our eligibility requirements. Eligibility requirements include (some exceptions apply):

- 18 years of age and older
- · Not currently enrolled in school
- Resident of Ontario (Canadian Citizen, Permanent Resident, or Refugee Claimant with a 900 series SIN)
- Sufficiently proficient in speaking and listening in English

Using our training/learning programs, participants can learn how to create a resume and cover letter using Microsoft Word, and prepare for interviews (presentation skills, etc.). We don't create their resumes for them, we support them in developing it themselves.
